IHDA’s Board of Directors unanimously approved the redevelopment effort on Friday, May 21, 2021.

Rock Island Economic Growth Corporation d/b/a Economic Growth Corporation (GROWTH) worked diligently to provide a full scope of Shimer Square’s redevelopment plan, specifically detailing its intentions toward the McKee/Hostetter and Dezendorf Halls by converting the former residential halls into 51 units of rental housing featuring studio, 1, 2 and 3 bedrooms ranging in size from 580 to 1,125 SF. Amenities will include a community room, game room, library area, walking path, community garden, bike racks, and picnic tables and outdoor grill area. Total project costs exceed \$18.7 million that will result in the creation of an entirely new tax base for the city of Mount Carroll, create 200 construction jobs, and provide workforce housing to new residents who wish to call Shimer Square home.

GROWTH has extensive experience in using innovative financing and historic restoration to revitalize buildings and neighborhoods. Since taking ownership, GROWTH has engaged and worked with federal, state, and local sources to advance its redevelopment plan while stressing the importance of the campus, the benefits it will bring, and how vital it is to keep this important piece of history alive and redeveloped for the future.

We are eager to break ground on one of the many pieces that will transform the campus into a mixed-use, diversified portfolio of housing, business incubation, artist and community space that is sustainable, diverse, and an inclusive historic community asset built for the future.”
